JUTE WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

The Jute Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Jute Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1951 (Order J. (86)) as amended by the Jute Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1955 (Order J. (94)) and (2) the revocation of Order J. (94).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 13th January, 1956. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.
