## WESTMINSTER—MARCH 21, 1810.

This day the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molineux, Gentleman of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of his Majesty's Commission for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for settling and securing a certain annuity on Viscount Wellington, and the two next persons to whom the title of Viscount Wellington shall descend, in consideration of his eminent services.

An Act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters.

An Act to continue and amend three acts, for the improvement of the port and harbour of Drogheda.

An Act to enlarge the term and powers of two acts of his present Majesty, so far as the same relate to the road from Buckland Dinham to Radford Bridge, and from Midsomer Norton to Norton St Philip, and from Kilmersdon to Radstock, in the county of Somerset.

An Act for continuing the term, and amending two acts passed in the 29th and 35th years of his present Majesty, for amending the several roads therein described, so far as the said acts relate to the district of road from Bury to Harlingden, and from thence to Blackburn and Whalley, all in the county palatine of Lancaster; and also for making a branch of road from Portfield to the west end of the town of Padiham, in the same county.
