

NOTICE TO CREDITORS.

A CAUTION.

PENALTIES to the amount of FIFTY POUNDS sterling have lately been recovered and paid, in an action brought before the Sheriff of Edinburgh, by the direction of the Postmaster General for Scotland, against a very respectable mercantile house, (having also an extensive correspondence all over Scotland), for offending against the Statute of the 9th of Queen Anne, cap. 10, § 17, by sending Letters in Parcels, and other Packages, by Coaches to and from Edinburgh, and their Correspondents at different places in the country.

It is hoped that this prosecution will have the desired effect to put a stop to such illegal practices; and although, in the present instance, the Penalties exigible under the act have been greatly mitigated, in consequence of the unqualified submission of the parties to the clemency of the Postmaster General, yet in future no such lenity will be shown; it being determined, that whenever any person is convicted, the full Penalties, as well as expences, will be exacted, without abatement.
