THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 15 of the Finance Act, 1956
viz.:—

The Investment Allowances (Fuel Economy Plant) Order, 1957.

Section 15 (3) (b), Finance Act, 1956, provides that investment allowances are to be continued for expenditure incurred after 17th February, 1956, on prescribed fuel-saving plant if it is installed by way of modification or replacement of plant in use in the United Kingdom. The Investment Allowances (Fuel Economy Plant) Order, 1956, prescribed a list of fuel-saving plant and the conditions, if any, upon which such plant was prescribed. The present Order prescribes, as from the date when it comes into operation, the following additional items of fuel-saving plant, subject to the conditions shown opposite each in the Schedule to the Order:—

Paragraph 2 (a): oil drip feeders.

Paragraph 4 (c): flash steam vessels; piping, ducts, and fans.

Paragraph 8 (b): fuel meters.

Paragraph 9: heat pumps.

Paragraph 10: capacitors.

The Schedule to the present Order is a comprehensive list of the plant prescribed under both Orders.

The Order comes into operation on the 5th June, 1957, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1957, No. 938.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 7th June, 1957, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £240,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 11th June, 1957, to Saturday, the 15th June, 1957, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the

amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (MARRIED WOMEN) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1957

IN accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of Pensions and National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Married Women) Amendment Regulations, 1957.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations substantially reproduce (in a modified form) and extend those provisions of the National Insurance (Married Women) Regulations, 1948, which provide for the crediting of contributions for the purpose of determining the rate of unemployment and sickness benefit in the case of a woman whose marriage is terminated. They add to those Regulations provisions for taking into account, for the purpose of a retirement pension for a woman whose marriage has been dissolved and for the purpose of a death grant in respect of the death of such a woman, contributions paid by or credited to her husband. They also provide that the limitation (imposed by those Regulations in relation to some women entitled to certain descriptions of widow's pension payable otherwise than under the National Insurance Act, 1946) on the effect of deeming them to have satisfied one of the contribution conditions for a retirement pension shall cease on remarriage; and they provide, in a case where the limitation ceases in relation to a woman, for her to be credited with contributions as if she had not been entitled to the relevant widow's pension. The remaining provisions are of a consequential character.
