The QUEEN having been pleased to approve the appointment of Admiral Sir Martin Eric Dunbar-Nasmith, V.C., K.C.B., K.C.M.G., D.L., to be Vice-Lieutenant of the County of Moray, a Commission in his favour bearing date the 11th September, 1957 has been signed by the Lord Lieutenant.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th September, 1957, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £270,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th September, 1957, to Saturday, the 5th October, 1957, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which

may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:-

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF LEGAL ASSISTANTS (ENGLAND) IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 26 and under 40 years of age on 1st October, 1957 except that a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st October, 1957.

3. Nationality.

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:-

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so

resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. Qualifications.

Candidates must on the closing date for the receipt of applications be barristers called to the English bar or solicitors admitted in England. A period in chambers, experience at the bar or in a solicitor's office, or other legal experience (particularly experience of work similar to that carried out in the legal branches of one or more of the departments in which vacancies are to be filled), will be an advantage.

5. Competition.

The candidates who appear from their applications to have the best qualifications and experience will be invited to interview in London before a Selection Board, which will recommend to the Civil Service Commissioners those considered most suitable for appointment. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview. The Board will normally assess a candidate on his suitability for the general duties of the Legal Class, but specialised experience in one or more branches of legal practice will be taken into account. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

6. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

8. Marriage Gratuity.

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

9. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Persons who have been trained as teachers, elsewhere than in England and Wales, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

10. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

11. Fees.

Every successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

POST OFFICE OVERSEAS TELEGRAMS

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the rates of charge and routes available for telegrams from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands to places abroad will, from the 1st October 1957 be as shown in the tables hereunder.

Every service in respect of which a charge appears in the tables is at present available. Where no charge is indicated under any heading in respect of a particular destination the relative service is not at present available. The services available to particular destinations abroad are, however, liable to be suspended and the restrictions imposed are liable to be varied from time to time by any of the telegraph administrations and private operating agencies concerned. Subject to any such restrictions telegrams may be sent to every one of the destinations in the appropriate table over the routes specified.

Except where otherwise stated the service of urgent telegrams is available at a rate per word equal to twice the rate per word for a telegram to the same destination over the same route sent at the ordinary rate.

Where the total amount of the charge for a telegram would include an odd number of farthings the charge is raised to the next higher halfpenny.

The service of delivery on ornamental forms (LX) is available to the destinations indicated.

The route abbreviations "Govt" or "Imperial" or "via Ldn. C.T.O." signify that the telegram is dealt with in the U.K. by the Post Office. The route abbreviations "Commercial," "Northern," "P.Q." and "Western Union" signify that the telegram is handed over in the U.K. by the Post Office to the Commercial Cable Company, the Great Northern Telegraph Company, the French Telegraph Cable Company or the Western Union Telegraph Company respectively, for further treatment.
