The Chinoffic Code, which is found in the official telegram dictionary of the Chinese Administration, consists of three-letter groups. They should be charged at the rate of five letters, for example, JYT CQO IFX PUH OJL would be charged as three words and transmitted as JYTCQ OIFXP UHOJL.
