STOPPING UP OF A HIGHWAY IN RUTHERGLEN

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, authorising the stopping up of a length of India Street at Rutherglen.

Copies of the Order and relative plan may be inspected at the offices of the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh, 11, or at the Rutherglen Town Council, Council Chambers, Rutherglen, at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of Part III of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, or that any requirement of Schedule VI of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from 14th January 1958, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th January, 1958, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £260,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th January, 1958, to Saturday, the 25th January, 1958, inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
