THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under the Second Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, as amended by Section 11 of the Finance Act, 1951, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939
viz.:—

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 2) Order, 1958, which provides for the allowance of drawback of Customs duty paid on certain handbag frames when ladies' handbags incorporating those frames are exported.

The Order comes into operation on the 28th January, 1958, and has been published as Statutory Instruments, 1958, No. 91.
