PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of January, 1958 (N.P. 1985/57) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Schedule III of Order in Council dated the 15th March, 1951, and Schedule III of Order in Council dated the 19th October, 1954, certain rates of Specialist Pay were laid down for Medical and Dental Officers of the Royal Navy of the ranks of Surgeon Commander and Surgeon Commander (D) and below while appointed for duty as Senior Specialist or Specialist:

"And whereas by Schedule 1 of Order in Council dated the 19th October, 1954, Surgeon Commanders and Surgeon Commanders (D) who are recognised Senior Specialists at the time of their promotion to Surgeon Captain and Surgeon Captain (D) enter the scale of full pay at the 'after 4 years' rate of pay:

"And whereas we are of opinion that these arrangements require revision and that an allowance should be introduced for all non specialist Medical Officers below the rank of Surgeon Captain who hold the Diploma in Public Health or analogous qualification:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction with effect from the 1st day of July, 1957, the proposals contained in the Schedule annexed hereto and in substitution for the provisions previously authorised:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"1. *Medical Officers' Specialist Pay.*

"To Medical Officers of the rank of Surgeon Captain who are appointable as Senior Specialist at the rate of 12s. 0d. a day and Surgeon Commanders and below who are appointable as Senior Specialist or Specialist at the rates of 12s. 0d.

and 4s. 0d. a day respectively. These rates to be paid continuously, irrespective of whether a specialist appointment is held.

"2. *Dental Officers' Specialist Pay.*

"To Dental Officers of the rank of Surgeon Captain (D) who are appointable as Senior Specialist at the rate of 12s. 0d. a day, and Surgeon Commander (D) and below who are appointable as Senior Specialist or Specialist at the rates of 12s. 0d. and 4s. 0d. a day respectively. These rates to be paid continuously, irrespective of whether a specialist appointment is held:

"3. *Surgeon Captains and Surgeon Captains (D).*

"Rate of full pay.

"Surgeon Commanders and Surgeon Commanders (D) promoted to the rank of Surgeon Captain or Surgeon Captain (D) before the 1st July, 1957, to cease to be eligible for the benefit of the 'after 4 years' rate of full pay as from the date on which they receive Senior Specialist Pay of 12s. 0d. a day. All Surgeon Commanders and Surgeon Commanders (D) promoted to the rank of Surgeon Captain or Surgeon Captain (D) on or after the 1st July, 1957, to enter the scale of full pay for Surgeon Captain or Surgeon Captain (D) at the minimum rate.

"4. *Medical Officers' Diploma Pay.*

"To non specialist Medical Officers of the rank of Surgeon Commander and below who hold the Diploma in Public Health or analogous qualification at the rate of 4s. 0d. a day.

"Diploma Pay not to be paid concurrently with Specialist Pay."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 7th February, 1958, at 4 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £230,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 10th February, 1958, to Saturday, the 15th February, 1958, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent, (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz:—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANTS (SCIENTIFIC) IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

- Both men and women may compete.
- A candidate may make only one application under these Regulations during the year.

## 3. Age.

Candidates must be at least 17½ and under 26 years of age on 1st January, 1958. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces or as a member of H.M. Overseas Civil Service may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st January, 1958.

(b) for a certain number of vacancies, candidates born on or before 1st January, 1932, who have specialised experience may be admitted. There is no upper age limit, but in appointing persons in a permanent capacity Departments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and the Commissioners will take this requirement into account.

## 4. Nationality.

(1) To be eligible for appointment (other than to a situation in the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry or Ministry of Supply) a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight

years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment;

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

(2) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry or Ministry of Supply unless (i) at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and (ii) he was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and (iii) each of his parents was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times from birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may, if the conditions specified in paragraph (1) of this Regulation are satisfied, be admitted to appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, the Secretary of State for War, the Secretary of State for Air, or the Minister of Supply, as the case may be.

#### 5. Educational Qualifications.

Every candidate must, on the date he sends in his application, be in possession of one of the undermentioned qualifications:—

(a) A School Certificate with credit in mathematics or a science subject obtained by passing an examination conducted by one of the recognised Examining Bodies.

In place of a School Certificate a candidate may produce evidence of having passed the Matriculation Examination of London University or any other examination which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners is of equivalent or higher standard; or

(b) A general Certificate of Education in four subjects at Ordinary (or Advanced) level to include (a) English Language and (b) a scientific or a mathematical subject; or

(c) The Scottish Leaving Certificate in four subjects on the lower (or higher) grade which include English and a scientific or mathematical subject.

Passes in subjects at the Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination will be accepted as equivalent to passes in the Scottish Leaving Certificate.

A pass on the higher grade in English or science whether gained at the Scottish Leaving Certificate Examination or the Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination will be accepted as the equivalent of a pass in two subjects on the lower grade if the Scottish Education Department certifies that the appropriate standard was reached in both papers set in the subjects concerned.

Scottish candidates who do not hold the requisite number of passes in the Scottish Leaving Certificate Examination or the Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination may, in appropriate circumstances, offer instead a Certificate of equivalent qualification based on their results in either or both of these examinations.

(Applications for Certificates, including those which relate to performance in the Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination, should be made to the Secretary, Scottish Education Department (Examinations Branch), Government Buildings, Broomhouse Drive, Saughton, Edinburgh, 11, quoting S59/58); or

(d) The Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland showing passes in four subjects including English Language and one of the following:— Mathematics (Traditional), Mathematics (Alternative), Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Biology, or a statement from the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland showing that the candidate has attained a standard equivalent to that represented by the award of the School Certificate of the Oxford and Cambridge Schools Examination Board, including the special qualification in mathematics or a science subject, or by the General Certificate of Education in four subjects at Ordinary level including English Language and a scientific or mathematical subject; or

(e) The Ordinary National Certificate. (The Commissioners may admit as eligible under this paragraph candidates who have satisfactorily completed the second year (s 2) of the Senior Course); or

(f) The Intermediate Examination of the Institute of Medical Laboratory Technology; or

(g) An Intermediate Grouped Course Certificate of the City and Guilds of London Institute in Telecommunications, Metallurgy, Paint Technology, Fuel Technology or Laboratory Technicians' work; or

(h) A pass in either the Forces Preliminary Examination with a pass in either mathematics or natural science; or

the Royal Air Force Higher Education Test, Part I, with a pass in mathematics, mechanics or the properties of matter; or

the Admiralty Higher Educational Test, Second Class, with a pass in mathematics or mechanics or magnetism and electricity; but

(i) The Commissioners may also accept as eligible candidates who are unable to comply with the requirements above but who

(i) have been employed on Assistant (Scientific) duties for a considerable time, have demonstrated their aptitude for this kind of work and are certified by their Department as being worthy of special consideration; or

(ii) have served for at least 10 years, on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement, in the technical branch of H.M. Forces. Such candidates must have served an artificer apprenticeship (where appropriate) or have reached the rank of Petty Officer or Sergeant; or

(iii) are employed full-time as glass-blowers in Government Departments, provided they are nominated by their Department and satisfy the Commissioners of their skill in their craft. Such candidates must be wholly employed in the construction of glassware for use in scientific laboratories.

#### 6. Experience.

Every candidate must have had thorough experience in the duties of the class gained by service in a Government Department or other civilian scientific establishment or in technical branches of the Forces. The experience must cover a minimum period of two years to be completed before the date on which he sends in his application, as duties appropriate to the type of vacancy for which application is made and the two-year period must be recent, subject to allowance for gaps in cases where the experience has been broken by service in H.M. Forces.

#### 7. Competition.

The Commissioners may summon a candidate to a preliminary informal interview and may require a candidate to undergo a practical or other test.

Those candidates who from the information available and the result of any test that may be imposed appear to have the most suitable qualifications and experience will be summoned to attend before a Selection Board appointed by the Commissioners.

#### 8. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

#### 9. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Persons who have been trained as teachers in Northern Ireland or in the Irish Republic, and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Commissioners.

#### 10. Refund of Marriage Gratuity.

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

#### 11. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

12. *Fee.*

Every successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

13. *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will decide the Department to which each successful candidate is to be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service but the wishes of candidates will be met as far as possible.

14. The decision of the Commissioners will be final in all matters concerning this competition.

Treasury, the following amendment has been made in the Regulations for the recruitment of Postal and Telegraph Officers in the Post Office dated 7th January, 1958, and published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 10th January, 1958, viz:—

Coventry has been added to the list of Head Post Office areas for which candidates must be at least 16 and under 25 years of age on the governing date.

Clause 2 of the regulations governing the competitions has been amended accordingly and now reads as follows:—

2. *Age.*
