At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 28th day of *January*, 1958.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of January, 1958 (N.P. 182/58) in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of service in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And Whereas under various Orders in Council rates and conditions for the award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities, have been laid down for Officers, ratings and other ranks of Your Majesty's Royal Navy and Royal Marines:

"And Whereas a surplus of Officers and men on the Active List exists in certain Branches, Ranks and seniorities, and special provision is necessary to reduce the Lists to the establishments estimated to be necessary:

"And Whereas we are of opinion that revised Service retired pay and pensions regulations should be introduced for Officers and men in order to provide compensation for those whose careers are prematurely terminated and to provide special resettlement grants for those retiring under existing regulations.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise the award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and other benefits at the rates and subject to the conditions specified in the Schedules attached hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE I.

*Section I.*

*"Service Retired Pay for Permanent Royal Navy and Royal Marines Officers.*

"1. The provisions of this Section relate to Officers holding permanent commissions in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, who are borne in Branches, Lists or Ranks in which the numbers borne exceed requirements and who are in consequence prematurely retired from the Active List after 4th April, 1957.

"2. An Officer nominated for premature retirement may be granted retired pay on the scales and under the rules prescribed by Order in Council of 24th January, 1957, Schedule I, Clauses 4 to 6 and 24 to 31, provided that he has completed at least 10 years qualifying service as defined in Clauses 27 to 29 of that Schedule. The condition in Schedule I Clause 26 of that Order limiting its application to retirements before 1st November, 1957, shall be suspended for the purposes of this Order.

"3. *Special rules relating to Officers promoted from the lower deck.*

"An Officer promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal Regular engagement and who serves continuously until retired may be granted

(a) retired pay on premature retirement assessed as in Clause 2, or

(b) the Service pension or gratuity that he would qualify for under the rules laid down in Clause 7, if he is not eligible for (a).

"4. *General.* These special terms will not be applicable to Officers who may be retired for misconduct, nor to Officers whom for unsatisfactory record or for other reasons, the Admiralty do not consider worthy of receiving them.

"5. These special terms will not be applicable to any Officer who retires at the end of his normal career, or is invalided or who is permitted to leave the R.N. voluntarily, for his own reasons, compassionate or otherwise.

*"Section II.*

*"Terminal Grants in Addition to Service Retired Pay for Permanent Officers.*

"6. Any Officer prematurely retired from the Active List after 4th April, 1957, and awarded retired pay under Section I of this Schedule may be awarded a terminal grant in addition to his retired pay under the following conditions:—

(a) the rate of grant will in all cases be three times the actual amount of the retired pay awarded,

(b) an Officer can qualify only once for a grant,

(c) a grant will be free of Income Tax.

*"Section III.*

*"Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers.*

"7. Officers retiring prematurely under the terms of this scheme may on retirement after 4th April, 1957, if ineligible for Service retired pay, be granted a gratuity at the rate of £100 for each year of qualifying service, the actual amount being calculated on the basis of each month or part of a month completed. An Officer promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal Regular engagement

and who serves continuously until retired shall be granted in lieu of gratuity a service pension if he would qualify under the rules laid down in Schedule II for ratings' pensions.

*"Section IV.*

*"Special Capital Payments in Addition to Service Retired Pay or Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers.*

"8. Any Officer prematurely retired from the Active List after 4th April, 1957, and granted retired pay pension or a Service gratuity under Sections I or III of this Schedule may be awarded a special capital payment in addition to his retired pay pension or gratuity under the following conditions:

(a) An Officer can qualify only once for a grant.

(b) The grant will be free of Income Tax.

(c) These payments will be based on the paid rank held at the time of retirement whether this be acting temporary or substantive.

"9. The scale of the grant will be as follows:

(a) Officers with 15 years or more qualifying service

*Notes:* (a) The special capital payments shown are based on the compulsory retiring ages normally applicable. The special capital payments to Officers who have reserved rights to compulsory retiring ages other than those shown for their ranks will be based on their individual compulsory retiring age. The special capital payments to special categories of Officers agreed between the Admiralty and the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury will be based on appropriate scales.

(b) These amounts will be payable if the Officer is within one month of his last birthday. For each com-

plete month by which his age exceeds an exact number of years, the amount payable on his last birthday will be abated by 1/12 of any difference between that amount and the amount payable on his next birthday.

(c) Officers with at least 10 but less than 15 years qualifying service:

The payment to be made will be: either

(i) an amount reckoned by abatement from the maximum special capital payment for their rank at the rate of £500 per year for the period by which their qualifying service falls short of 15 years, calculation of actual abate-

ment being made on a monthly basis, or

(ii) the amount which would have been payable under (a) above if the Officer concerned had completed 15 years qualifying service, whichever is the lesser.

(c) Officers with less than 10 years qualifying service:

A special capital payment will be made up to a maximum of £5,000 payable to the Officer retired within one month of completing 10 years qualifying service. For Officers retiring earlier the amount payable will be calculated by abatement from the maximum payment at the rate of £500 a year for the period of short-fall. The actual calculation of abatement will be made on a monthly basis.

#### "SECTION V.

##### "Special Resettlement Grant in Addition to Service Retired Pay or Service Gratuities

"10. Any permanent Officer up to and including the rank of Captain R.N., removed from the Active List after 4th April, 1957, on compulsory retirement for age or non-employment or after invaliding, may be awarded a resettlement grant in addition to his retired pay or gratuity under the following terms:

(a) The rate of grant will in all cases be £500.

(b) An Officer can qualify only once for a grant.

(c) The grant will not be payable in addition to the special capital payment under Section IV.

(d) The grant will be free of Income Tax.

(e) The grant will not be payable to those who are permitted to retire voluntarily for their own reasons compassionate or otherwise nor to those who are compulsorily retired for misconduct or incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency, unless the causes are not within the Officer's own control and he has completed 15 years qualifying service.

"11. A resettlement grant under Clause 10 shall also be admissible in the case of an Officer re-employed without a break in service on completion of re-employed service, or, at the discretion of the Admiralty on removal from the Active List. In the case of an Officer re-employed after a break in service a grant will be payable on his ceasing after 4th April, 1957, at least 12 months re-employed service.

"12. A resettlement grant under Clause 10 shall not be admissible on retirement from the Active List in the case of Officers employed after retirement on certain Inspection, Research, Design and Experimental Ordnance duties and in certain other special posts under Orders in Council of 13th December, 1921, 26th May, 1925, and 23rd July, 1931, and subsequent amending Orders in Council, or any other such posts as have been or shall be created at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"13. A resettlement grant under Clause 10 shall also be admissible in the case of an Officer serving on a temporary commission and retired from the Active List after 4th April, 1957, on compulsory retirement for age or non-employment after service as rating and officer totalling 15 years or on invaliding before completing engagements totalling 15 years.

"14. A resettlement grant under Clause 10 shall also be admissible in the case of an Officer holding a Supplementary List or Short Service Commission who is compulsorily retired for age or non-employment at the end of engagements totalling 15 years of which the last 10 years must have been continuous or on invaliding before completing such engagements.

#### "SCHEDULE II.

##### "SECTION I.

##### "R.N. Ratings and Royal Marines Service Pensions.

"1. The provisions of this Section relate, except where otherwise stated, to R.N. ratings and Royal Marines who are serving on pensionable engagements after 4th April, 1957; they do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered Ratings.

"2. Service pensions granted under this Section will consist of the sum of elements for service and for rank assessed at the rates prescribed in Order in Council of 24th January, 1957, Schedule III, Clause 2.

"3. A Service pension assessed as in Clause 2 may be granted to a R.N. rating or Royal Marine prematurely discharged if he has completed at least 10 years reckonable service.

"4. These special terms for pension are not to apply to a R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is discharged at the end of his current engagement or is invalided or who has left or shall leave the Royal Navy voluntarily for his own reasons, compassionate or otherwise, nor to any who is discharged for misconduct or inefficiency.

"5. In assessing rank element of pension all paid rank will be taken into account.

"6. The provisions of Order in Council of 9th October, 1956, and previous pensions increase Orders in Council will not apply to pensions awarded under the foregoing provisions of this Section.

##### "Reckonable Service.

"7. Reckonable Service for the purpose of determining entitlement to pension and the rates of pension under this Order will be calculated in the manner defined in Order in Council of 24th January, 1957, Schedule III, Clauses 8 to 12, saving that in the case of those who have served at least 10 years:

(a) To the service actually reckoned as rendered is to be added the notional sum of 5 years or such lesser sum as may cover the outstanding period of the current engagement provided that this addition does not extend the reckonable service beyond the end of the current engagement.

(b) Service added under (a) for the purpose of calculating pension will be treated as if rendered in the existing rating or rank.

#### "SECTION II.

##### "Terminal Grants in Addition to Service Pension.

"8. Ratings and Royal Marines discharged to pension under the terms of Section I will be awarded on discharge a terminal grant at the rates prescribed in Order in Council of 24th January, 1957, Schedule II, Clause 13, saving that only 10 years reckonable service calculated as in Clause 7 will be necessary to qualify. Reckonable service for the purpose of determining rate of terminal grant will be calculated in accordance with Clause 7 above.

"9. Rank for assessing the grant will be the rank held immediately preceding discharge.

"10. The grant will be free of Income Tax.

#### "SECTION III.

##### "Special Capital Payments in Addition to Pension.

"11. The provisions of this Section relate, except where otherwise stated, to R.N. ratings who are prematurely discharged with entitlement to Service pension or terminal grant as ruled in Sections I and II, after 4th April, 1957. They do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered Ratings.

"12. Subject to the following provisions a R.N. rating or Royal Marine who has 15 or more years reckonable service preceding his discharge will be granted a special capital payment as follows:—

Where service is terminated 3 or more years before the end of the current engagement: £1,250.

Where service is terminated 2 years before the end of the current engagement: £1,000.

Where service is terminated 1 year before the end of the current engagement: £750.

Where service is terminated at the end of the current engagement (Section IV): £250.

"13. For a R.N. rating or Royal Marine who has 10 years but less than 15 years reckonable service the amount payable will be:

14 years	...	...	...	...	£1,200

"14. Payments to ratings whose services are terminated at intermediate points will be calculated proportionately on a daily basis.

"15. For any rating who has signed a further engagement pension, terminal grant and special capital payment will be calculated by interpreting the outstanding period of current engagement as inclusive of the further engagement up to a limit of 5 years.

"16. Reckonable service for the purpose of determining entitlement to special capital payment will be as given in Order in Council of 24th January, 1957, Schedule III, Clauses 8 to 12.

"17. The special capital payments to special categories of ratings agreed between the Admiralty and the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury will be based upon appropriate scales.

#### "SECTION IV.

##### "Special Resettlement Grant in Addition to Service Pension for R.N. Ratings or Royal Marines.

"18. Any R.N. Rating or Royal Marine, who leaves the Royal Navy after 4th April, 1957, on completion of, or on invaliding when engaged to complete, engagements totalling

not less than 22 years service or 15 years service of which the last 10 years should have been continuous, may be awarded a resettlement grant in addition to his pension under the following terms:—

- (a) The rate of grant will in all cases be £250.
- (b) A R.N. rating or Royal Marine can qualify only once for a grant.
- (c) The grant will not be payable in addition to the special capital payment under Section III.
- (d) The grant will be free of Income Tax.
- (e) The grant will not be payable to any R.N. rating or Royal Marine who has left or shall leave the Royal Navy voluntarily for his own reasons, compassionate or otherwise nor to any who is compulsorily discharged for misconduct or inefficiency unless when the causes are not within his own control he has completed 15 years' reckonable service.

#### "SCHEDULE III.

"Pensions for Widows and Children of Regular Naval and Marine Officers, Temporary Branch Officers, Regular Long Service Ratings and Royal Marine Other Ranks.

"1. Pensions at the rates set out in Order in Council of 31st October, 1956, Section I, may be granted to the widow and children of a permanent Regular Officer who dies after premature retirement, provided that the Officer was granted Service retired pay under Schedule I, Section I, of this Order.

"2. Pensions may be granted to the widow and children of a rating or marine prematurely discharged to pension at the rates and under the conditions set out in Order in Council of 31st October, 1956, Clause 6 (i) and (ii) provided the rating or marine had reckonable service for pension of the length stipulated, calculated in accordance with Schedule II, Clause 7, above.

"3. Awards under this Schedule, will be subject to the conditions set out in Order in Council of 31st October, 1956, Section IV.

#### "GENERAL.

"1. The Admiralty reserves the right of withholding permission to retire or be discharged under these regulations from any Officer or man.

"2. Nothing in these regulations shall preclude the Admiralty from retiring any Officer or discharging any man during the currency of the scheme under any other regulations which may be applicable to his case.

"3. No officer or man who has at one time received any benefit under these regulations in respect of retirement or discharge at that time may be granted any benefit under them in respect of retirement or discharge at another time notwithstanding that he may be re-engaged or re-employed in such conditions and with such a termination as would bring him within its scope again.

"4. Officers and men who re-enter the Forces or who, within two years of the date of compulsory premature retirement, take up Retired Officer or similar posts in the Service or other departments, or who obtain established appointments in the Civil Service or the Foreign Service under special schemes for reserving vacancies for ex-members of the Forces, may be required to refund such part of the special capital payment they will have received under this scheme as may be decided by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
