BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1956 (Order D.(117)) as amended by the First Schedule to the Wages Regulation (Boot and Shoe Repairing) (Amendment) Order, 1957 (Order D.(121)), (2) the same amendments to the Wages Regulation (Boot and Shoe Repairing) (Holidays) Order, 1956 (Order D.(119)) as are now contained in the Second Schedule to Order D.(121), and (3) the revocation of Order D.(121).
