At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 7th day of May, 1958.

**PRESENT**

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of April, 1958 (N.P. 749/58) in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 1st November, 1956, and the 5th April, 1957, certain rates of pay and allowances were laid down for Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th April, 1949, certain rates of Marriage Allowance were laid down:

"And whereas we are of opinion that certain of these rates of pay and Marriage Allowance require revision:

"And whereas we consider that Recruiting Staff Officers, Royal Navy and Royal Marines should be placed on Naval conditions of service:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the proposals contained in the Schedules annexed hereto, with effect from the 5th day of April, 1958, except where otherwise provided:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

**"SCHEDULE I—GENERAL.**

"1. The rates of full pay and marriage allowance in the following Schedules to apply, subject to the regulations issued by the Admiralty, to Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and also, in accordance with their several ranks and subject to the regulations governing their service, to Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and the Royal Marine Forces Volunteer Reserve, while serving or training in H.M. Ships or Establishments or while called out for actual service in war or emergency. The rates prescribed not to apply to National Service Officers or to Officers appointed for time only or otherwise holding naval rank for purposes of status only.

"2. Increments of pay for R.N.R., R.N.V.R. and R.M.F.V.R. Officers to continue to depend on mobilised service on naval rates of pay in the confirmed rank.

"3. National Service Officers to continue to receive full pay and marriage allowance in accordance with the provisions of Order in Council dated the 1st November, 1956.

"Where the resultant total as calculated above, exceeds 46s. 0d. the Sub-Lieutenant to retain his rating's emoluments, plus 2s. 0d. a day until promoted to Lieutenant. If, on promotion, the rate of pay in issue based on rating's emoluments does not exactly equal a point in the Lieutenants' scale, the point of entry to the scale to be the point immediately above. Officers to proceed by normal increments from their point of entry to the maximum of the Lieutenants' scale.

"3. Recruiting Staff Officers R.N. and R.M. to have the status of a Commander R.N. or Major R.M. respectively.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine

Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated 15th March, 1957, and 23rd September, 1957, a new pay code and revised rates of pay were introduced from 1st April, 1956:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to increase the rates of pay and marriage allowance and to introduce a higher rate of marriage allowance for ratings entitled to, but not provided with, married quarters or official residences:

"And whereas Orders in Council dated 29th September, 1949, and 9th April, 1951, provided for extra pay for divers:

"And whereas we consider it expedient to introduce revised conditions and rewards for diving for both officers and ratings and to abolish the daily rates of diving pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the proposals set out in the accompanying Schedules, to have effect from the 5th April, 1958, except where otherwise provided:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

"SCHEDULE I

GENERAL

"The rates of pay and marriage allowance in the following schedules apply, subject to the regulations issued by the Admiralty, to ratings and other-ranks of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines other than National Servicemen and ratings recruited abroad for local service, and also, subject to the regulations governing their service, to ratings and other ranks of the Royal Naval and Royal Marine Reserves while serving or training in H.M. Ships or Establishments or while called out for actual service in war or emergency.

2. The standard rate and the Non-continuous Service Higher Scale of pay are applicable to ratings serving on engagements for nine years service or more, or having more than nine years total service; and the seven year rate or the Non-continuous Service Lower Scale for ratings serving on engagements of less than seven years service.

"Exercises in Recompression Chambers—The extra pay for such exercises will be half the standard rate for divers for the depth represented. Attendants in recompression chambers under pressure may receive the same rate as for divers.

"2. Exercises in Submarine Escape—Payment by the scale as for standard divers may be made to Officers and men of the Submarine Branch when they are carrying out practical submarine escape drill and duties at the Submarine Escape Training Tank, H.M.S. DOLPHIN. No allowance is payable to Officers and men undergoing training in the technique.

"SCHEDULE XVIII

"Hazard Money—Divers in search of explosives or working inside wrecks may receive payment at the rate of six and one half of the scale appropriate to the equipment used.

"2. And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 19th day of February, 1958, Notice of such Representation was given and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 10th day of April, 1958, and that the said Order, or notice thereof, should be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and that copies of the said Order or notice should be fixed on the doors of the church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish of Cadder one month before the said 10th day of April, 1958:

And Whereas Notice of the said Representation and of the time when it pleased Her Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council has been duly published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and fixed in manner required by the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. That in terms of section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855 burials be forthwith discontinued in the Burial Ground known as Chryston Old Burying Ground in the Parish of Cadder and County of Lanark except for the burial of cremated human remains as may be authorised by the County Council of Lanark;
