The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 2) Order, 1958.

The Import Duty Drawbacks Order, 1958 (S.I. 1958 No. 1122) provided for drawbacks of protective duty allowable under the Import Duties Act, 1958. That Order was made on 8th July and is to come into operation on 1st January, 1959. In this interim period, certain changes have been made in the drawbacks currently allowable, and certain corrections have been made in the transposition of the existing rates of duty into Brussels Nomenclature terms, with consequential effects on drawbacks. The present Order provides for these changes and also for certain other drawbacks, at present allowed under existing legislation, which were omitted from the previous Order.

This Order also provides, as from 1st January, 1959, for the allowance of new drawbacks of protective duty on the exportation of—

- certain canned or bottled foodstuffs made from specified descriptions of tomato purée or paste;
- certain paper bags made from specified descriptions of unbleached grease-proof paper or glazed transparent paper; and
- stearine and oleine fatty acids, and certain cloth oils and wool oils containing oleine fatty acids, made from animal tallow or bone grease.
