NOTICE is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly have made the following Orders:—

*Statutory Instruments 1959 No. 1335*

*The Diseases of Animals (Ascertainment of Compensation) Order, 1959*  
(Made 28th July, 1959)

This Order, which comes into operation on the 1st September, 1959, re-enacts with minor amendments the provisions of Articles 13 and 14 of the Animals (Miscellaneous Provisions) Order of 1927. It prescribes how the value of an animal slaughtered under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, by the direction of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food or Secretary of State for Scotland is to be ascertained and, if the value is not agreed, provides that it shall be ascertained by arbitration. It does not apply where any enactment or statutory instrument provides any other method for ascertaining values.

*Statutory Instruments 1959 No. 1336*

*The Exportation of Horses (Amendment) Order, 1959*  
(Made 28th July, 1959)

This Order, which comes into operation on the 1st September, 1959, is made under Section 37(6) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950. It increases the fee payable for the veterinary examination of a horse under that section, before export, from 5s. to £1. The Exportation of Horses Order of 1910 (No. 2) is amended accordingly, and the Exportation of Horses (Amendment) Order of 1919 is revoked.

ADVERTISEMENTS) (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS,  
1948 to 1951

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Scotland in exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 29 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, and Regulation 10 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (Scotland) Regulations, 1948 has approved with modifications an order defining as an area of special control for the purposes of those Regulations the whole of the landward part of the County of Angus with the exception of certain villages and built-up areas described in the Schedule hereto, which area of special control is shown edged and coloured grey on the map referred to in the order.
