NOTICE is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85(3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly have made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1959 No. 1787
The Poultry Carcases (Landing) Amendment Order, 1959
(Made 20th October, 1959)

This Order, which comes into operation on the 2nd November, 1959, amends the First Schedule to the Poultry Carcases (Landing) Order, 1955, so as to exclude the Channel Islands (except the Islands of Jersey and Alderney) from the countries from which the importation of poultry carcases is permitted. Importation of poultry carcases from Jersey and Alderney continues to be permitted unconditionally.

Statutory Instruments 1959 No. 1788
The Poultry and Hatching Eggs (Importation) Amendment Order, 1959
(Made 20th October, 1959)

This Order, which comes into operation on the 2nd November, 1959, amends the First Schedule to the Poultry and Hatching Eggs (Importation) Order of 1947 so as to exclude the Channel Islands (except the Islands of Jersey and Alderney) from the countries from which the importation of poultry and hatching eggs is permitted. It also adapts the provisions of that Order to transport by air.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PART OF EAST HALLHILL ROAD
