MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 IMPORTED BACON CUT INTO SLICES OR RASHERS

AN application for an amendment to the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1934, (S.R. & O. 1934 No. 299) to require that imported bacon cut into slices or rashers be marked with an indication of origin has been referred for enquiry to the Standing Committee set up under the Act by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland.

Under the provisions of the Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale. They also have discretion to consider and report whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
