CONSOLIDATION OF ENACTMENTS

NOTICE is hereby given, pursuant to section one of the Consolidation of Enactments (Procedure) Act, 1949, that in order to facilitate the consolidation of certain enactments relating to Distress for Rates, the Lord Chancellor intends on the 1st December, 1959, to lay before Parliament a memorandum proposing corrections and minor improvements in certain of those enactments.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946 SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, to provide for (a) the improvement by realignment and regrading of two lengths of Stratton Road in the County of Inverness, (b) the construction by the Secretary of State of a new road in substitution for a length of Stratton Road to be stopped up by the Order, (c) the stopping up of a part of the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road and a length of Stratton Road when the new trunk road and the new road are opened for the purposes of through traffic and (d) the Inverness County Council becoming the highway authority for the new road on the date when the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order, relative plan and an explanatory note may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 27th November, 1959, to 29th February, 1960, at the offices of the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead

Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh, 11, and the Inverness County Council, County Buildings, Ardross Street, Inverness.

Any Person may within three months from 27th November, 1959, object to the making of the Order by notice to the Secretary, Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh, 11, quoting reference 317/75/1 and stating the grounds of objection.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946 SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made the London-Carlisle-Glasgow-Inverness Trunk Road (Douglashall Road and Other Improvements) Order, 1959, under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, which trunk road Order provides for (a) the improvement by regrading of a length of Douglashall Road, two lengths of the Gibsons-Scroggs Road and a length of Ettrickholm Road all near Castlemilk in the County of Dumfries, (b) the construction by the Secretary of State of a new road in substitution for a length of the Castle milk Mill-Birkshaw Road and two lengths of the London-Carlisle-Glasgow-Inverness Trunk Road to be stopped up by the Order, (c) the stopping up of a length of the Castle milk Mill-Birkshaw Road and two lengths of the London-Carlisle-Glasgow-Inverness Trunk Road when the said new road is opened for the purposes of through traffic, (d) the stopping up of a length of Douglashall Road and a further length of the London-Carlisle-Glasgow-Inverness Trunk Road and (e) the Dumfries County Council becoming the highway authority for the new road on the date when the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the Order and of the relative plan have been deposited at the Scottish Home Department Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh, 11, from whom copies of the Order can be obtained, and at the offices of the Dumfries County Council, County Buildings, Dumfries, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.
