CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

THE SHAWHEAD SMOKE CONTROL AREA ORDER,
 1959

1. NOTICE is Hereby Given that the Secretary of State on the Twenty-Fourth day of November 1959, confirmed the above Order made by The Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the Burgh of Coatbridge, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.

2. The said Order shall come into operation on 1st August 1960, after which date, (subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of Section 11(4) of the said Act), if on any day smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are: anthracite and semi-anthracite, briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuels, and low volatile steam coals.

3. Copy of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge in the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Dunbeth Road, Coatbridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays and 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on other week days.
