THE BURGH REGISTER OF SASINES (EARLS-FERRY)

DISCONTINUANCE ORDER, 1960

Made 5th January 1960

Coming into operation 5th January 1950

WHEREAS the Town Council of the Burgh of Elie and Earlsferry have intimated under sub-section (1) of section 1 of the Burgh Registers (Scotland) Act, 1926(a) that the office of the keeper of the burgh register of sasines for the Burgh of Earlsferry has become vacant:

Now, Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said sub-section the Secretary of State hereby orders as follows:

- 1. The burgh register of sasines for the Burgh of Earlsferry shall be discontinued from and after the 29th day of February nineteen hundred and sixty.
- 2. This Order shall be recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines applicable to the County of Fife.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Burgh Register of Sasines (Earlsferry) Discontinuance Order, 1960.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, 15th January 1960, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £270,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 18th January 1960, to Saturday the 23rd January 1960, inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

### WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959

JUTE WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Jute Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Jute) Order, 1958 (Order J.(100)) and (2) the revocation of Order J.(100).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 12th January 1960. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Jute Wages Council (Great Britain), Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.
