## STOPPING UP OF A HIGHWAY IN DUMFRIES

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, as read with section 9(4) of the Land Powers (Defence) Act, 1958, and the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, authorising the stopping up of a length of Pascolly Close, in the Burgh of Dumfries.

Copies of the Order and relative plan may be inspected at the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh 11, or at the Dumfries Town Council Offices, Municipal Chambers, Dumfries.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of Part III of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, or that any requirement of Schedule VI of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from 10th June 1960, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Treasury Chambers S.W.1.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 21(1) of the Finance Act, 1948 as amended by Part II of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1958, entitled The Purchase Tax (No. 3) Order, 1960.

This Order brings into force a new list of drugs and medicines which are free of purchase tax. The list supersedes the existing list shown in the Purchase Tax (No. 1) Order, 1960, as amended by the Purchase Tax (No. 2) Order, 1960.

The new list comprises all substances and preparations exempted under those Orders, but certain substances formerly classified by reference to their chemical names are now entered according to the name approved by the British Pharmacopoeia Commission. Such entries in the Schedule to the Order, others which appear for the first time and amendments to existing entries are printed in Heavy type.

The Order comes into operation on the 15th June 1960 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1960 No. 968.

## WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959

STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL-WARES WAGES COUNCIL  
(GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) varying the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1958 (Order Q.(88)) and (2) the revocation of Order Q.(88).

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 10th June 1960. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.
