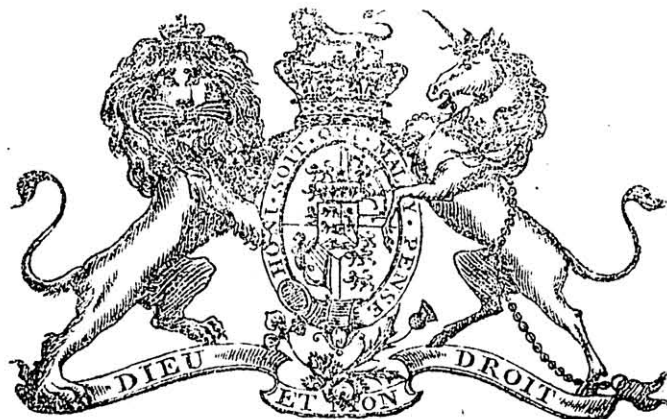

PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by his Majesty in Council, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Tuesday the 21st day of this instant August, be further prorogued to Thursday the 1st day of November next.

This day the Right Hon. Richard Lord Viscount Chetwynd was, by his Majesty's command, sworn one of the clerks of his Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council in Ordinary, in the room of Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knt. whom his Majesty has been graciously pleased to permit to retire from the said office.

FOREIGN-OFFICE—JULY 27, 1810.
