This day the Chevalier De Souza Coutinho, heretofore Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from his Royal Highness the Prince Regent of Portugal, had a private audience of his Majesty to deliver new Credentials as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from his Royal Highness.

To which he was introduced by the Marquis Wellesley, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
