SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949

INVERGARRY AND CLUANIE INN DIVERSION

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, the effect of which will be that the road from Bun Loyne in the County of Inverness to its junction with the existing Invergarry-Kyle of Lochalsh Trunk Road east of Cluanie Inn in the County of Ross and Cromarty, and the road which has been constructed in the County of Inverness by the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board in pursuance of "The North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board (Constructional Scheme No. 23) Confirmation Order, 1949" as amended by "The North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board (Constructional Scheme No. 23C) Confirmation Order, 1957" will become a trunk road and the lengths of the existing trunk road extending from a point 145 yards or thereby east of the centre of Daingean Bridge to a point 25 yards or thereby west of the said bridge and extending from its junction with the Class III road leading to Kinloch Hourn, 170 yards or thereby west of Tomdoun Hotel to its junction with the new trunk road 260 yards or thereby east of Cluanie Inn will cease to be a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into operation and the remaining length of the existing trunk road extending from a point 25 yards or thereby west of Daingean Bridge to its junction with the Class III road leading to Kinloch Hourn will cease to be a trunk road on the sixteenth day of May 1962, on which date the County Council of Inverness will become the highway authority responsible for the said length of road.

2. An Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, to provide for the stopping up of two lengths of the Invergarry-Kyle of Lochalsh Trunk Road in the Counties of Inverness and Ross and Cromarty when this Order comes into operation.

Copies of the draft Orders, relative plans and an explanatory note may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 12th May 1961, to 14th August, 1961, at the offices of the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh 11, Inverness County Council, County Buildings, Ardross Street, Inverness, Ross and Cromarty County Council, County Buildings, Dingwall, the Post Office, Invergarry, Inverness-shire, the District Clerk's Office, 7 Heathmount Place, Kyle, Ross and Cromarty and at Cluanie Inn, Cluanie, Ross and Cromarty.

Any Person may within three months from 12th May 1961, object to the making of the Orders by notice to the Secretary, Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh 11, quoting reference 316/75/3 and stating the grounds of objection.
