FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE—FINAL FIGURES.

The number of animals slaughtered as diseased or exposed to infection for the period 1st January to 31st March 1961 was 23,310 and from 1st January to 30th June 1961, 24,787.

The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated: Cattle plague or rinderpest (*pestis-bovina*, 1877; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; glanders (including farcy *ma.* 1928; parasitic mange *psoroptes et sarcoptes scabiei equi*), 1948; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum* 1898; rabies, 1922; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850; and sheep scab (*scabies ovium*), 1952. Dourine (*exanthema carolinense paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
