#### BURGH OF COWDENBEATH

#### THE BURGH OF COWDENBEATH (STATION ROAD AND STENHOUSE STREET) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 1962

26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is set out in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE

Save as hereinafter provided no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in (a) that length of Station Road, Cowdenbeath, which extends from its junction with High Street to its junction with Factory Road, and (b) that length of Stenhouse Street, Cowdenbeath, which extends from its junction with High Street to its junction with Hall Street.

Nothing in this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to for so long as may be necessary:

- (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; or
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; or
- (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878.
