RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS FROM THE LOCAL LOANS FUND

NOTICE

THE Treasury hereby give notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Public Works Loans Act 1964, the following rates of interest shall be charged on loans made out of the Local Loans Fund on the security of local rates on and after 1st April 1964.

The amount which an authority borrows within its annual quota will bear interest at the appropriate rate in the lower set of rates. Where authorities borrow further sums these will attract interest at the appropriate rate in the higher set of rates, unless the Public Works Loan Commissioners agree that they should be offset against the following year's quota. Different rates of interest apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by way of half-yearly payments (A) or at maturity (M). shall be construed as references to the appropriate rate in the higher set of rates

STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS AT FASLANE, DUNBARTONSHIRE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955 and section 8 of the Land Powers (Defence) Act, 1958, entitled the Stopping up of Highways (Dunbartonshire) (No. 2) Order 1964 authorising the stopping up of a length of the Class I road A.814, a length of the classified Glen Fruin Road and a length of the unadopted road known as Shandon Station Road, all at Faslane, Dunbartonshire.
