This day his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, Regent of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, by virtue of an act passed in the present Session of Parliament, entitled, "An act to provide for the administration of the Royal Authority; and for the care of his Majesty's Royal Person, during the continuance of his Majesty's illness; and for the resumption of the exercise of the Royal Authority by his Majesty," was, at his first coming into the Council, pleased to declare, that understanding that the law required that he should take and subscribe certain oaths and declarations, he was now ready to do so; his Royal Highness, accordingly, took and subscribed the oaths and declarations required by the said act; after which all the members present of his Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council had the honour of kissing his Royal Highness's hand.
