BRIDGE OF ALLAN TOWN COUNCIL  
BURGH WATER SUPPLY

NOTICE Is Hereby Given in terms of Paragraph 1 of Part I of the First Schedule to the Water (Scotland) Act, 1946, that the Town Council of the Burgh of Bridge of Allan are allowed to apply to the Secretary of State for Scotland for an Order by which powers conferred by Sections 21 2, 47 1, 44 1 and 1 of the Water (Scotland) Act, 1946, as amended by the Water (Scotland) Act, 1949.

The Order would enable the Town Council to construct an additional intake on the Wharry Burn Lade at a point 20 paces or thereabouts in an easterly direction from Pindich Farm to supplement the Burgh's Water Supply with the condition that no water will be otherwise diverted from the Wharry Burn Lade while the flow of the lade below this intake is less than 50,000 gallons per day, or (in the months of May to November) when the level of water in the Coxburn Reservoir is 582.92 feet or more above ordnance datum (Liverpool).

A copy of the draft Order (known as the Bridge of Allan Intake on the Wharry Burn Lade) Water Order, 1965, plans relative thereto, and a Written Statement may be inspected free of charge in the office of the Subscriber between the hour of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive during the period of 28 days from 26th November 1965, being the date of the first publication of this notice. BURGH OF CLYDEBANK  
CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

*The Boquhanran Smoke Control Area Order Number 5 196*

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Town Council of the Burgh of Clydebank in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 8th day of November 1965 made an Order entitled the Boquhanran Smoke Control Area Order Number 5 1965 described therein and defined in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for confirmation.

Subject to any exemption provided by virtue of section 14 of the Act on any day after the Order has come into operation no fire shall be emitted from a chimney or any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of the smoke is not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. Authorised fuels are: Anthracite and semi-anthracite, fire-dried fuel, bonified in the process of manufacture, coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuel, and low volatile steam coal.

3. Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Department, Municipal Building, Clydebank, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the Third day of December 1965.

4. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by Notice in writing to The Secretary of State for Scotland, 43 Jersey Street, Edinburgh object to the Confirmation of the Order.
