A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING A PROCLAMATION, DATED THE 22ND DAY OF JUNE, 1966, DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT 1920, AS AMENDED BY THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT 1964.

Whereas by Our Proclamation, dated the twenty-second day of June, nineteen hundred and sixty-six, We declared that the stoppage of work among merchant seamen did, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the Emergency Powers Act 1920, as amended by the Emergency Powers Act 1964:

And whereas it appears to Us that the state of emergency has now ceased to exist and that it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be revoked accordingly:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim that the said Proclamation is revoked.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.
