PROPUCTIVITY AGREEMENTS

ON 24th August 1966 in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Labour referred the question of Productivity Agreements to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination.

The Board has now made its report and in accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Labour hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 3311 on 13th June 1967.

WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

FUR WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Fur Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby give notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Fur Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order 1953 (Order Z.(61)) as amended by Schedule 2 to the Wages Regulation (Fur) Order 1963 (Order Z.(81)) and (2) the revocation of Order Z.(61) and Schedule 2 to Order Z.(81).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 14 days from 16th June 1967. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Fur Wages Council (Great Britain), Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.

THE Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that on 8th June 1967 he made the Carcinogenic Substances Regulations (S.I. 1967 No. 879).

Subject to the power of the Chief Inspector to grant exemptions in certain cases, the presence, manufacture and use of certain substances known to be carcinogenic are prohibited. These are betanaphthylamine, benzidine, 4-aminodiphenyl and 4-nitrodiphenyl and their salts.

The conditions under which other suspected substances are manufactured and used are also specified. These are alpha-naphthylamine, ortho-tolidine, dianisidine, dichlorbenzidine and their salts. The use of auramine and magenta is also controlled. Provision is made for medical examination of persons exposed to these substances.

The Regulations come into operation on 9th December **19**67.

POST OFFICE OVERSEAS TELEGRAPHS

DATEL SERVICE

HER Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that a Datel service providing for data to be transmitted over telephone circuits at speeds up to 150 characters per second will become available between the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man on one hand and Norway on the other, on 12th June 1967.

Her Majesty's Postmaster General further gives notice pursuant to regulation 20 of the Telephone Regulations 1965 that forthwith and until further notice, the charge for Datel calls from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man on the one hand to Norway on the other hand will be as follows:

> Minimum charge for a call not exceeding three minutes

> > 16s.

Charge for each additional minute or part thereof 5s. 4d.
