THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 2(3) of the Purchase Tax Act 1963.

Viz.: The Purchase Tax (No. 1) Order 1967.

This Order consolidates the list of drugs and medicines which were free of purchase tax on 30th April 1967. The list supersedes the existing list shown in the Purchase Tax (No. 1) Order 1966 and includes the items subsequently exempted from tax by directions of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise under Section 17(3) of the Purchase Tax Act 1963.

The Order does not exempt any additional substance or cancel any existing exemption, but some items previously listed under their chemical names now appear under the names approved by the British Pharmacopoeia Commission.

The Order comes into operation on 29th June 1967 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1967 No. 886.

COSTS AND PRICES OF ALUMINIUM SEMI-MANUFACTURES

Direction Under Section 5(4) Further Extending the Period Within Which the National Board for Prices and Incomes Must Publish Their Report

WHEREAS the First Secretary of State and the President of the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published

the text of the reference in the Gazette on 26th August 1966;

2. And whereas by Section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to Section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. And whereas the First Secretary of State and the President of the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under the said Section 5(4), by a direction published in the Gazette on 22nd November 1966, extended the said period of three months by four months, by a direction published in the Gazette on 17th March 1967, further extended the said period of three months by two months, and by a direction published in the Gazette on 12th May 1967, further extended the said period of three months by one month;

4. Now therefore the First Secretary of State and the President of the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under the said Section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be further extended by one month.

COSTS AND CHARGES IN THE MOTOR REPAIRING AND SERVICING INDUSTRY

Direction Under Section 5(4) Further Extending the Period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes Must Publish Their Report

WHEREAS the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Technology, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 26th August 1966;

2. And whereas by Section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to Section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. And whereas the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Technology, in pursuance of their powers under the said Section 5(4), by a direction published in the Gazette on 22nd November 1966, extended the said period of three months by four months, by a direction published in
