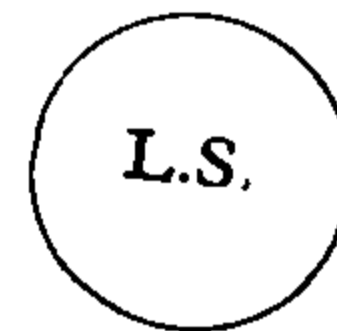

The Townhead Smoke Control Order, 1967

1.
