PRESENT

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 73) it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend the Order in Council dated 25th September 1964, as amended (Orders of 22nd December 1964, 24th February 1966, 9th June 1966, 28th July 1966), concerning pensions and other grants in respect of disablement or death due to service in the naval forces during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1964 Order"):

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered that, notwithstanding anything in the 1964 Order, the following provisions of this Order shall take effect accordingly and, except in the cases stated in the Order in Council of 19th December 1881, and except as otherwise provided by statute, shall be established and obeyed as the sole authority in the matters herein treated of.

Substitution of Schedules to the 1964 Order

- (1) For Schedules 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 to the 1964 Order (rates of pensions and other grants payable in respect of disablement or death due to service in the naval forces during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939) there shall be substituted the Schedules set out in Part I of the Appendix hereto and numbered 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7, respectively.

- (2) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Article, Table 3 of the said Schedule 3 shall continue to apply in relation to an award made before 30th October 1967 as it would have been applied had this Order not issued:

Provided that—

- where any part of the sum payable under any such award falls due for payment on or after 30th October 1967 there shall be substituted for that part an amount which bears the same proportion to the sum which would have been payable under that award had it been made on or after that date as the said part bears to the sum payable under the award;
- so much of the substituted amount payable to a member under any such award as remains unpaid at any time on or after the said 30th October may, if the member so requests the Minister, be paid to him forthwith as a gratuity.

Amendment of Articles of the 1964 Order

- In Articles 1, 11, 23, 29, 31, 33, 38 and 60 of the 1964 Order there shall be made the amendments set out in Part II of the Appendix hereto.

Commencement

- (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, this Order shall come into operation on 30th October 1967 so, however, that in relation to any awards payable weekly the foregoing reference to 30th October 1967, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following 30th October 1967.
- (2) Article 1(1) shall come into operation in relation to an officer on 1st November 1967.
- (3) In so far as Article 1(1) substitutes the higher rates of allowance for wear and tear of clothing specified in paragraph 4 of Schedule 6 in Part I of the Appendix hereto, it shall come into operation on 1st November 1967.

PART II

Amendments of Articles of the 1964 Order

1. In Article 1 for paragraph (6) (definition of apprentice) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

“(6) “apprentice” means a person undergoing full-time training for any trade, business, profession, office, employment or vocation, and receiving not more than nominal wages:”.

2. In Article 11 (gratuity and weekly allowance for minor disablement) the words “or a weekly allowance with or without a terminal gratuity” shall be omitted.

3. In Article 23 (allowance for part-time treatment) in the proviso for the words “Article 13, 14, 15, 16, 17(1)(i), 18 or 20” there shall be substituted the words “Article 13, 14, 14A, 15, 16, 17(1)(i), 18 or 20.”

4. In Article 29 (pensions to widows who were separated) in paragraph (2) for the words “shall be at the discretion of the Minister, but shall not exceed” there shall be substituted the words “shall be such rate as the Minister may think fit having regard to.”

5. Paragraph (2) of Article 31 (rent allowance to widows, and unmarried dependants who lived as wives, who have children) is hereby revoked.

6. In Article 33 (temporary allowances to widows and unmarried dependants who lived as wives of severely disabled pensioners) in paragraph (3) for the words from “at the discretion of the Minister” to the end of the paragraph there shall be substituted the words “such rate as the Minister may think fit having regard to the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) or (b) of Article 29(2) as the case may require, but shall not exceed the rate appropriate in her case under paragraph (2) of this Article.”

7. In Article 38 (education allowance) in paragraph (1) for the words “an award has been made” there shall be substituted the words “an award has or, but for the provisions of Article 33, would have been made.”

8. In Article 60 (payment of public claims out of pensions) for paragraph (2) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

“(2) Where payment in respect of a pension is in arrears for any period and benefit under the Ministry of Social Security Act 1966 (1966 c. 20) has been paid for that period by reference to the requirements of the person to whom the payment is due, the amount by which the benefit paid exceeds what would have been paid had the said payment not fallen into arrears shall be deemed to have been an over-payment for the purposes of paragraph (1) of this Article.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order further amends the Order of 25th September 1964.

Article 1 substitutes new Tables for those contained in Schedules 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 to the 1964 Order and has the effect of increasing—

- a. the rates of pensions in respect of 100 per cent. disablement by £43 a year in the case of officers and by 17s. a week in the case of ratings and the rates of pensions for lower degrees of disablement and awards for cases of minor injuries and other cases of less than 20 per cent disablement proportionately;
- b. the rates of pensions for certain widows by £31 a year in the case of officers and by 12s. a week or 6s. 8d. a week to 10s. a week in the case of ratings (according to the rate applicable);
- c. the maximum rates of disablement addition on a pension payable to certain officers in receipt of service retired pay by £43 a year;

- g. the total additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) from £130 a year to £145 12s. a year in

the case of officers and from 50s. a week to 56s. a week in the case of ratings;

- h. the allowances payable in respect of children of unemployable pensioners or of pensioners receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) in respect of the first or only child from £58 10s. a year to £65 a year in the case of officers and from 22s. 6d. a week to 25s. a week in the case of ratings and in respect of other children from £37 14s. a year to £44 4s. a year in the case of officers and from 14s. 6d. a week to 17s. a week in the case of ratings, but for the fourth and subsequent children in the family these increased rates will be reduced by £13 a year in the case of officers and 5s. a week in the case of ratings;
 - i. the allowances for comforts from £52 a year and £26 a year to £65 a year and £32 10s. a year in the case of officers and from 20s. a week and 10s. a week to 25s. a week and 12s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings;
 - j. the maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation from £140 8s. a year to £158 8s. a year in the case of officers and from 54s. a week to 61s. a week in the case of ratings;
 - k. the allowances payable to pensioners who have attained the age of 65 years and whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 40 per cent. or over from between £13 and £39 a year to between £19 10s. and £52 a year in the case of officers and from between 5s. and 15s. a week to between 7s. 6d. to 20s. a week in the case of ratings;
 - l. the maximum of the additional person treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who has attained the age of 65 years from £39 a year to £52 a year in the case of officers and from 15s. a week to 20s. a week in the case of ratings;
 - m. the maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions from 80s. a week to 90s. a week;
 - n. the maximum pensions payable to unmarried dependants who lived as wives of deceased members of the naval forces from £279 a year to £309 a year in the case of officers and from 97s. 6d. a week to 109s. a week in the case of ratings;
 - o. the maximum rent allowance payable to certain widows from 40s. a week to 45s. a week;
 - p. the allowances payable to elderly widows or unmarried dependants who lived as wives of pensioners, at the age of 70 years or over, from £26 a year to £39 a year where the pensioner was an officer, and from 10s. a week to 15s. a week in other cases;
 - q. the maximum pensions payable to certain widowers from £279 a year to £310 a year in the case of officers and from 105s. a week to 117s. a week in the case of ratings;
 - r. the allowances payable to widows in respect of children from £122 10s. a year to £129 a year in the case of officers, from £116 10s. a year to £123 a year in the case of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Warrant Officers and from 44s. a week to 46s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings but these increased rates will be reduced by £13 a year in the case of those officers' children and 5s. a week in the case of those ratings' children who qualify for family allowances at the rate of 15s. a week;
 - s. the rates of pensions and allowances payable to or in respect of children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mothers) from £170 10s. a year to £190 a year in the case of children of officers, from £122 10s. or £162 10s. a year to £129 or £182 a year (according to the age of the child) and in the case of children of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Warrant Officers and from 44s or 62s a week to 46s. 6d. or 69s. 6d. a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of ratings, but reductions as in r. above will be made;
 - t. the maximum rates of pensions payable to motherless children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes, from £208 a year to £234 a year in the case of children of officers and from 80s. a week to 90s. a week in the case of children of ratings.
- Article 1 also provides for the making of lump sum payments to ratings where an interim award is made in respect of disablement assessed at less than 20 per cent. Hitherto a weekly allowance for a limited period (with or without a terminal gratuity) has been paid.
- Article 2 makes various further amendments and in particular—
- a. provides for the rate of maintenance payable under a Court Order or being paid by a husband before death to be regarded as a guide in determining the rate of

pension or temporary personal allowance payable to a separated widow and not, as hitherto, as the upper limit;

- b. removes a restriction on the amount of rent allowance payable to a separated widow;
- c. amends the definition of apprentice;
- d. substitutes for references to assistance under the National Assistance Act 1948, references to benefit under the Ministry of Social Security Act 1966;
- e. corrects minor errors of omission.

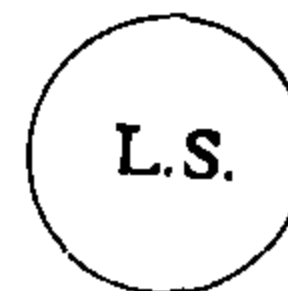
