NOTICE Is Hereby Given That, on the Twenty-fifth day of June Nineteen Hundred and Sixty-eight, the Secretary of State amended the above Development Plan.

A certified copy of the Development Plan as amended by the Secretary of State has been deposited at the Office of the County Clerk, County Buildings, Paisley, and a certified copy of the Development Plan amended as aforesaid has also been deposited at the office of the District Clerk, Third District Council, District Council Offices, Bishopston.

Each copy of the amended Development Plan so deposited is available for inspection by the public, free of charge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. daily excluding Saturdays and Sundays.

The Amendment of the Development Plan became operative as from the Second day of July 1968, but if any person aggrieved by the amendment desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the amendment, he may, within six weeks from the Second day of July 1968, make an application to the Court of Session.

BURGH OF PAISLEY
CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

*The Paisley No. 9 (Williamsburgh) Smoke Control
Area Order, 1968*

1. NOTICE Is Hereby Given that the Town Council of the Burgh of Paisley, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 11th day of June 1968, made an Order entitled the "Paisley No. 9 (Williamsburgh) Smoke Control Area Order, 1968," declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11(4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are: anthracite (including semi-anthracite), briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuels, fluidised char binderless briquettes and "Multiheat" briquettes manufactured by the National Coal Board, and low volatile steam coals.

3. The Order will not come into operation until at least six months after it is confirmed by the Secretary of State, and in any event not before 1st October 1971.

4. Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Chief Sanitary Inspector, at 20 Back Sneddon Street, Paisley, from 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays, during the period of six weeks from the Ninth day of July 1968.
