## WESTMINSTER—MAY 21, 1811.

This day the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An act for raising the sum of four millions nine hundred eighty-one thousand three hundred pounds, by way of annuities.

An act to explain and amend two acts of the 50th and 51st years of his present Majesty, for continuing certain duties on malt, sugar, tobacco, and snuff, and other purposes mentioned in the said acts.

An act for increasing the rates of subsistence to be paid to innkeepers and others on quartering soldiers.

An act for more effectually repairing and improving certain roads in the county of Stirling, and the road from or near from the west end of the town of Linlithgow to Stirling, in the counties of Linlithgow and Stirling.

And to several English road, &c. acts, and eleven private acts.

## WHITEHALL—MAY 25, 1811.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to constitute and appoint Field Marshal his Royal Highness Frederick Duke of York to be Commander in Chief of all his Majesty's Land Forces in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.
