PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Report by the National Board for Prices and Incomes

Certain agreements and a question relating to the terms and conditions of employment of workers in the road haulage industry.

ON 9th August 1968, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Transport referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their report:

 - (iv) Meachers Transport (Birmingham) Limited on 18th June 1968,
 - (v) A. S. Jones Limited on 22nd April 1968,

(vi) Kirkdale Lewis Haulage Limited on 26th April 1968,

(vii) LEP Transport Limited on 7th June 1968,

(viii) Liverpool Central Oil Co. Limited on 3rd April 1968;

- (b) the agreement between the Scottish Commercial Motormen's Union on the one hand and Pollock (Musselburgh) Limited, Saddlers Transport Limited, Russell of Bathgate Limited, W. H. Malcolm Limited, Charles Alexander and Partners (Transport) Limited, George T. Fraser, Bruce Lindsay Haulage Limited, John Barrie (Contractor) Limited, Glasgow Hiring Co. Limited, Alexandra Transport Limited, Connal and Co. Limited on the other hand reached at meetings held on 14th March and 18th March 1968.
- (c) the question as to what considerations should apply in the negotiation of pay and productivity agreements in the road haulage industry generally, and having regard particularly to the agreements referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) above.

PAY OF VEHICLE MAINTENANCE WORKERS IN BRITISH ROAD SERVICES

4. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Power, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be further extended by six weeks.

REVISION OF TOLLS

Each motor car, including motor car with 3 wheels, or taxi, each motor cycle with sidecar, each motor scooter with sidecar; each passenger-carrying vehicle or tractor not exceeding 30 cwts. unladen weight; each goods vehicle with a plated weight not exceeding 3½ tons or (not having a plated weight) with an unladen weight not exceeding 30 cwts.	3/-

Motor bicycles, etc.

2. Each motor bicycle without sidecar, each motor scooter without sidecar, each power assisted bicycle or tricycle. Nil.

Scheduled buses

3. Each public service vehicle on a scheduled service journey, provided prior notification of the journey is given to the Board. 5/-

Other vehicles

4. Each other vehicle, not requiring an escort, with a plated weight exceeding 3½ tons or (not having a plated weight) with an unladen weight exceeding 30 cwts. 10/-

Escorted vehicles

5. Each vehicle requiring an escort. £5

A vehicle shall be deemed to require an escort if it does not conform to the requirements as to dimensions or weight of the Motor Vehicles Construction and Use) Regulations 1963 unless, in the opinion of the Board or any responsible officer of the Board, no escort is required.

RADIOTELEGRAMS SENT BY RADIOTELEPRINTER FROM SHIPS
AT SEA TO TELEX SUBSCRIBERS: CONDITIONS

HER Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice, in accordance with paragraphs (2) and (3) of Regulation 13 of the Telegraph (British Commonwealth and Foreign Written Telegram) Regulations 1959, that the following conditions shall apply in relation to radiotelegrams which, at the request of the sender, are transmitted by direct printing telegraphy from a ship at sea equipped with apparatus which has been approved by the Postmaster General for this purpose through a land station in the United Kingdom direct to the telex machine of the addressee, being a subscriber to the telex service, in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man:

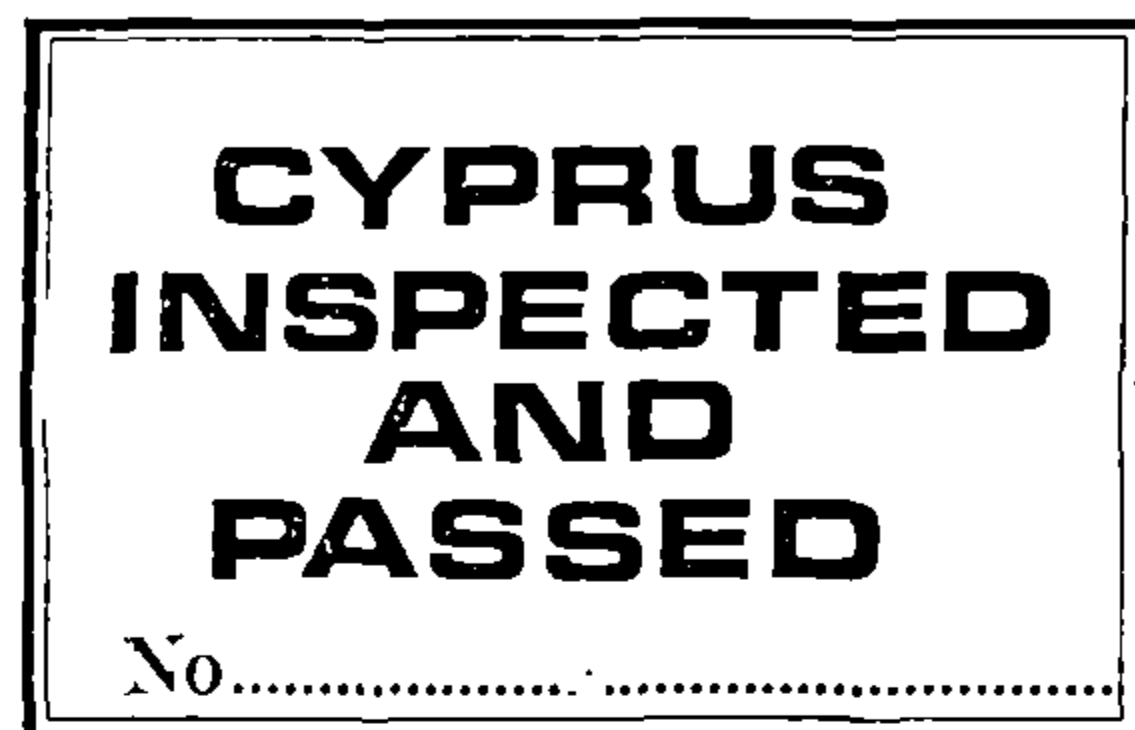
