TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 28th March 1969, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 31st March 1969, to Thursday, the 3rd April 1969, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

STEEL PRICES

Direction under section 5(4) extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their report

WHEREAS the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Power, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 24th December 1968;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Power, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be extended by six weeks.

STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS IN THE BURGH OF JOHNSTONE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1946 as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955, authorising the stopping up of part of Midton Road in the Burgh of Johnstone. The title of the Order is the Stopping Up of Highways (Burgh of Johnstone) (Midton Road) Order 1969.

Copies of the Order, which specifies the actual length of the road to be stopped up may be inspected at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh 1, or of the Town Clerk, Town Hall, Church Street, Johnstone.

Any Person may, within three months from 30th March 1969 object to the making of the Order by notice in writing to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh 1, quoting reference R/CLR/4/JOH/1 and stating the grounds of objection.
