PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes of an arbitration award relating to payment for overtime worked by employees in the London Clearing Banks to whom the award applies.

THE First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, acting in pursuance of her powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refers to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their examination and report the award dated 19th September 1969 of the Arbitration Tribunal set up in accordance with the constitution and rules of the Joint Negotiating Council for Banking providing, amongst other things, with effect from 1st July 1969, that staff in the London Clearing Banks, other than of managerial status, shall be entitled to payment of overtime in respect of work carried out in excess of seven hours per working day.

THE Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that on 19th November 1969 she made the Fees of Appointed Factory Doctors Order 1969.

This Order determines, subject to any agreement between the appointed factory doctor and the occupier of a factory, the amount of fees payable by occupiers of factories to appointed factory doctors for various services required under the Factories Act 1961. It increases the fees fixed in 1968. The following Orders are revoked: S.I. 1968 No. 937, 1968 No. 1771 and 1969 No. 813.

STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS IN THE BURGH OF KIRKCALDY

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under Section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1947, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955 authorising the stopping up of part of Fitzroy Street, Dysart, Kirkcaldy. The title of the Order is the Stopping

Up of Highways (Fitzroy Street, Dysart, Kirkcaldy) Order 1969.

SPECIAL ROADS ACT 1949

THE KINROSS AND MILNATHORT BYPASS SPECIAL ROAD

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the Kinross and Milnathort Bypass Special Road (Side Roads) (Variation) Order 19 to provide for alterations to the alignment of two new roads to be constructed at Manse Road and Hattonburn Road, Milnathort under the Kinross and Milnathort Bypass Special Road (Side Roads) Order 1969.
