And whereas Her Majesty was further pleased to except from the number of the said Counsellors of State His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, and His Royal Highness Prince William of Gloucester while absent from the United Kingdom:

And Whereas the Secretary of State for Scotland has, in pursuance of the powers competent to him under section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act 1855, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Extract Decree dated the 19th day of February 1970, pronounced by the Sheriff Substitute of Perth and Angus at Perth finding that the Burial Ground known as Moulin Churchyard in the Burgh of Pitlochry and County of Perth is in a condition which is dangerous to health and is overcrowded:

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. ## REFERENCE TO THE NATIONAL BOARD

## FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

## TEA PRICES

THE leading tea firms recently made increases in their selling prices and the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food consider that the increases should be examined by the National Board for Prices and Incomes in the light of the trends of costs, prices and profitability of the tea buying, blending, packing and distributing industry.

Accordingly, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and report the questions of the costs, prices and profitability of the tea buying, blending, packing and distributing industry.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958.

Viz.:—The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order, 1970

This Order provides for the temporary exemption from import duty, for specified periods, of dried chicory root, certain tinsplate ends for cans, and three chemicals. all as specified in the Schedule to the Order.

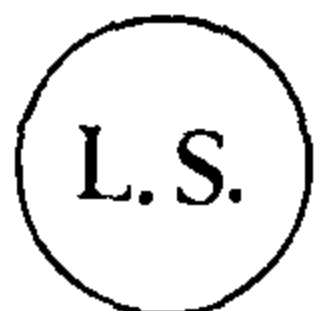

- (iv) Part XV of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 14th September 1937 and the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 14th August 1959 are hereby revoked.
