Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated 27th day of February, 1970, to delegate to the following Counsellors of State (subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned) or any two or more of them, that is to say, His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester and His Royal Highness Prince William of Gloucester, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas Her Majesty was further pleased to except from the number of the said Counsellors of State His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, and His Royal Highness Prince William of Gloucester while absent from the United Kingdom:

And Whereas the Secretary of State for Scotland has, in pursuance of the powers competent to him under section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act 1855, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Extract Decree dated the 19th day of February 1970, pronounced by the Sheriff Substitute of Perth and Angus at Perth finding that the Burial Ground known as Moulin Churchyard in the Burgh of Pitlochry and County of Perth is in a condition which is dangerous to health and is overcrowded:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that in terms of section 5 of the aforesaid Act burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Burial Ground except for the reservation of the right of burial of—

6. Colonel Ralph Stewart Stewart-Wilson, 21 Ovington Gardens, London S.W.3.
7. Robert Johnson, 20 Baledmund Road, Pitlochry.
8. Miss Jessie Jamieson, c/o Chequers, Atholl Road, Pitlochry.
9. Miss Robertson, Victoria Villa, Pitlochry.
10. Mrs Isabella Stewart, West View, Moulin, Pitlochry.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf give Notice of the said Representation and order that the same be taken into consideration on the 13th day of July next:

And do further direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette and that copies of this Order, or notice thereof, be fixed as required by the said Act on the doors of the church of or on some other conspicuous places within the parish or parishes affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.
