- (iii) Where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will only apply if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or meat product or the package containing the meat or meat product.
- (iv) Part XV of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 14th September 1937 and the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 14th August 1959 are hereby revoked.

Schedule

Part I

In relation to meat and meat products, a label or stamp of the following design:




The Certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the Establishment, and when affixed as a label it will also bear a date and the signature of the Veterinary Inspector.

Part II

For meat products namely prepared meals, a label in the form set out below:



The Certificate will be completed by the insertion of a date and the signature of the Veterinary Inspector.

Imports of uncooked meat and meat products from certain countries are restricted, and in some cases prohibited, on animal health grounds by the Importation of Carcases and Animal Products Order 1954, as amended. The recognition of an Official Certificate for public health purposes does not give exemption from such restrictions or prohibitions.
