STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS IN THE

ROYAL BURGH OF DUMFRIES

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1947 (as read with the Transfer of Functions (Road, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955), as amended by section 96 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1969, authorising the stopping up of parts of Murray's Close and Old Crown Close. The title of the proposed order is the Stopping Up of Highways (Royal Burgh of Dumfries) (Parts of Murray's Close and Old Crown Close) Order 1970.
