HEAVY GOODS VEHICLES (DRIVERS' LICENCES)  
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1971

THE Secretary of State for the Environment laid before Parliament on 11th May 1971 the above Regulations which came into operation on 12th May 1971 (S.I. 1971/736) price 7½p.

The Regulations make anyone who has had an epileptic attack since the age of 3 ineligible for the grant of a heavy goods vehicle driver's licence and extend the scope of the principle Regulations as a preliminary to reciprocal recognition of Great Britain and Northern Ireland heavy goods vehicle drivers' licences with effect from 1st July 1971.

PROPOSED WAITING RESTRICTIONS ON  
TRUNK ROAD (ROUTE A.90) IN  
BRIDGE OF EARN, PERTSHIRE

THE Secretary of State proposes to make an Order prohibiting waiting at any time on the east side of Main Street, Bridge of Earn from a point 5 yards or thereby south of the junction with Side Street to a point 40 yards or thereby north of that junction. Exceptions would permit a vehicle to wait for as long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded and for maintenance purposes. Disabled drivers would not be affected.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which together with a plan showing the proposed restrictions and a statement of the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours at the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh; and the County Offices, York Place, Perth.
