# BURGH OF AIRDRIE

(Bus Stops) (Clearway) Order 1972

ON 2nd March 1972, the Town Council of the Burgh of Aridrie made an Order under Sections 1(1), (2), (3) and (3B) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is set out in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE

The effect of the Order is to prevent the waiting of vehicles, other than a stage carriage or a scheduled express carriage, in prohibited areas at 'bus stops in Broomknoll Street, Alexander Street and Stirling Street between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. in any day.

# CORPORATION OF DUNDEE CLEAN AIR ACTS 1956 and 1968 The Dundee (Douglas) Smoke Control Area Order 1972

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Corporation of the City of Dundee in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, on the 2nd day of March 1972, made an Order entitled "The Dundee (Douglas) Smoke Control Area Order 1972", declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area. This Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for Confirmation and, if confirmed, will come into operation on the 1st day of October 1973. 2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11(4) of the Clean Air Act 1956, if on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are: —anthracite and semi-anthracite, briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuels, low volatile steam coals, fluidised char binderless briquettes and "Multiheat" briquettes manufactured by the National Coal Board, "Rexco Briquettes" manufactured by Scottish Rexco Limited and "XL Briquettes" manufactured by Taylor Brothers (Dundee) Limited. 3. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Town Clerk, City Chambers, Dundee, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 24th day of March 1972.

3. A copy of the order and map showing the roads affected are available at the Town Clerk's Office, Milton House, Dunoon, where they may be examined between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

4. Any person who wishes to question the validity of the order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the order, may within six weeks from the 14th March 1972, apply to the Court of Session for this purpose.

# BURGH OF EAST KILBRIDE CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

## The East Kilbride (South-East Extension) Smoke Control Area Order 1972

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the Burgh of East Kilbride in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the abovementioned Act on the 6th day of March 1972 made an Order entitled the East Kilbride (South-East Extension) Smoke Control Area Order 1972, declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for confirmation.

2. Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11(4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels are: —anthracite and semi-anthracite, briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture, coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuels, and low volatile steam coals.

3. The Order will not come into operation until at least six months after it is confirmed by the Secretary of State.

4. Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Department, Civic Centre, East Kilbride at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 24th day of March 1972.
