TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 30th June 1972, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £80,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 3rd July 1972, to Friday the 7th July 1972, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

BURGH OF BARRHEAD

The Burgh of Barrhead (Various Streets)
(Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1972

- 1. THE Town Council of the Burgh of Barrhead propose to make an Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.
- 2. When this Order comes into effect vehicles must not be left between the hours of 8 a.m. and 10 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, on any of the following lengths of roads, viz:—
 - (a) MAIN STREET from its junction with Spring-hill Road, west to its junction with Cross Arthurlie Street, on the north side, and Kelburn Street, on the south side.
 - (b) KELBURN STREET from its junction with Main Street, west to its east junction with the service road leading to Nos. 13 to 51 Kelburn Street, on the south side.

- Moreover vehicles must not be left between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, on any of the following lengths of roads, viz:—
- (a) MAIN STREET from its junction with Springhill Road, east to its junctions with Glen Street, on the north side, and Bank Street, on the south side.
- (b) GEORGE STREET from its junction with Cross Arthurlie Street, east to its junction with Henry Street—both sides.
- (c) ARTHURLIE STREET from its junction with Main Street, south to its junction with Lowndes Street, on the west side, and Heys Street, on the east side.
- (d) BANK STREET for its entire length—both sides.
- 3. Exceptions will permit waiting for the purpose of, viz:
 - (a) picking up and setting down passengers,
 - (b) loading or unloading goods, where necessary, in connection with:—
 - (1) the maintenance of the road, and
 - (2) the supply of gas, electricity and water, and by
 - (3) disabled drivers.
- 4. There will also be included in the Order restrictions on the loading and unloading of goods between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.15 a.m. and between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m., on both sides of Main Street from its junction with Springhill Road, west to its junction with Kelburn Street, (south side) and Cross Arthurlie Street, (north side), and on the south side of Kelburn Street, from its junction with Main Street, west to its junction with the service road leading to Nos. 13 to 51 Kelburn Street; which restrictions will however not apply to postal vehicles.
- 5. Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the roads affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the Town Clerk's Office, Bank Street, Barrhead, between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

(Traffic Experiment) (Buchanan Street, Etc.) Order 1972

THE Corporation of the City of Glasgow have made the above Order under Section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968. The Order will come into operation on 9th July 1972 and will introduce for an experimental period traffic regulation measures designed to afford priority to the pedestrian in the portion of Buchanan Street between St. Vincent Street and Argyle Street and the portion of Gordon Street between West Nile Street and Buchanan Street (which are referred to hereinafter as "the restricted roads") and to introduce certain measures designed to restrict the amount of vehicular traffic using Royal Exchange Square.

The effects of the Order are described in more detail in the Appendix.

APPENDIX

The effects of the Order will be:—

- (I) to close the restricted roads between the hours of 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive to all vehicular traffic except emergency service vehicles, vehicles driven by severely disabled drivers, vehicles carrying severely disabled passengers, vehicles requiring access to Princes Square and pedestrian controlled vehicles engaged in deliveries.
- (2) to prohibit all through traffic from using the restricted roads outwith the hours described in the preceeding paragraph, leaving the roads open for use

- (a) by pedestrians and
- (b) by vehicles requiring access to premises in the restricted roads or to premises accessible only from the restricted roads and vehicles picking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods.
- (3) to introduce a system of one way traffic in a southerly direction in Buchanan Street between St. Vincent Place and Argyle Street,
- (4) to prohibit vehicles from making a right hand turn from Buchanan Street into Argyle Street,
- (5) to discontinue the use of the restricted roads and of Royal Exchange Square as metered parking places and,
- (6) to prohibit (subject to certain exceptions) the use of Royal Exchange Square by vehicles other than vehicles requiring access to adjoining premises for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods.

THE CORPORATION OF GLASGOW

(Use of Maitland Street Car Park) Order 1972

THE Corporation of the City of Glasgow propose to make the above Order under Section 31 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968. The effect of the Order will be as follows:

- 1. To designate for use as a controlled parking place the area of ground at Maitland Street which has been laid out for use as a parking place;
- 2. To provide that the charge for leaving a vehicle in the parking place shall be 10p for a period not exceeding 24 hours;
- 3. To prescribe the manner in which vehicles shall stand in the parking place and to require that every part of a vehicle shall be within the limits of a parking bay;
- 4. To provide that a parking attendant may remove or arrange for the removal from the parking place of any vehicle in respect of which certain provisions of the Order have been contravened or not complied with;
- 5. To provide that severely disabled drivers or drivers of vehicles carrying severely disabled passengers may be exempted from payment of parking charges;
- 6. To provide that a "no ticket charge" of £1.00 shall be incurred if any vehicle (not being a vehicle exempt from the parking charge) is left in a parking place without the initial charge having been paid;
- 7. To make other incidental provisions.
