TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 15th September 1972, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £160,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 18th September 1972 to Friday the 22nd September 1972, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE ACQUISITION OF LAND (AUTHORISATION
PROCEDURE) (SCOTLAND) ACT 1947

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the above mentioned Acts has prepared a draft compulsory purchase order entitled the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Kincardineshire) (No. 2) Compulsory Purchase Order 1972, which he is about to make and which authorises him to purchase compulsorily for the purpose of an improvement of the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (A.92) at Cammachmore from a point 64 metres north of Newtonhill Crossroads to a point 247 metres south of Bourtreebush Crossroads, in the County of Kincardine, the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF TRUNK ROAD
(ROUTE A.73) AT WELLGATE, LANARK

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made an order temporarily closing to traffic that part of the Lanark-Abington trunk road (Route A.73) from its junction with High Street, Lanark (Route A.743) to its junction with South Vennel.

The closure (from 8 a.m. on Sunday, 10th September 1972 to 5 p.m. on Saturday, 23rd September 1972) is necessary to enable the laying of a gas main at Wellgate. Vehicles requiring access to premises situated on or adjacent to the length of road involved, will be unaffected.

Alternative Route for Traffic

Northbound traffic will travel via Ladyacre Road, St. Vincent Place and Bannatyne Street (Route B.7017) to its junction with High Street (Route A.743), thence by High Street to rejoin the trunk road. Southbound traffic will travel in the reverse direction.

PROPOSED 40 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT ON TRUNK
ROAD (ROUTE A.73) AT HYNDFORD ROAD, LANARK

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an order imposing a 40 m.p.h. speed limit on trunk road (Route A.73) at Hyndford Road, Lanark from a point 266 yards north west of the centre line of the junction with Home Street south eastwards to a point 10 yards south east of the centre line of the entrance to St. Mary's Cemetery a total distance of 1056 yards. Part of this length of road is at present subject to a 30 m.p.h. speed limit.
