SCHEDULE

The effect of the order, which comes into force on 24th November 1972, is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on certain lengths of High Street, Errol (Route B.958) as follows:

- a) On the south side of the road:
 - (i) from The Cross to its junction with Church Lane;
 - (ii) from its junction with the west side of South Bank in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 83 yards or thereby; and
 - (iii) from its junction with the east side of South Bank in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 15 yards or thereby.
- (b) On the north side of the road:
 - (i) for a distance of 40 yards or thereby westwards from The Cross;
 - (ii) on two sections west of its junction with Church Avenue for distances of 50 yards and 20 yards respectively, and
 - (iii) between its junction with Church Avenue and North Bank.

Exceptions will permit waiting on the said sections of road for the purposes of (a) picking up and setting down of passengers; (b) loading or unloading goods; and, where necessary, in connection with (c) the maintenance of the road; and (d) the supply of gas, electricity and water. A disabled person's vehicle displaying the appropriate badge, and not causing an obstruction, will also be exempt from the restrictions.
