THE KIRKCALDY (CHAPEL) SMOKE CONTROL AREA

The authorised fuels include anthracite or semi-anthracite, briquetted fuels carbonised in the process of manufacture (i.e. prepared smokeless fuel) coke, electricity, gas, low temperature carbonisation fuel and low volatile steam coals.
