WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

RETAIL BREAD AND FLOUR CONFECTIONERY
TRADE WAGES COUNCIL (SCOTLAND)

THE Retail Bread and Flour Confectionery Trade Wages Council (Scotland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Secretary of State for Employment proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration and holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Retail Bread and Flour Confectionery) (Scotland) Order 1972 (Order B.F.C.S.(30)); and (2) the revocation of Order B.F.C.S.(30).

Particulars of the proposals, which have been approved by the Pay Board, are contained in the Wages Council's Notice B.F.C.S. (31) which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals if made to it within 14 days from 26th February 1974. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Retail Bread and Flour Confectionery Trade Wages Council (Scotland), 12 St. James's Square, London SW1Y 4LL. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notice of Proposals B.F.C.S.(31).

CRANNOCH HILL DIVERSION SIDE ROADS

THE Secretary of State has made the following orders:—

1. An order for the construction of a new length of road to form part of the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (A.98) at Crannoch Hill in the County of Banff.
2. An order for (a) the stopping up of a superseded length of the existing trunk road and a length of the classified road B.9018 at its junction with the existing trunk road; (b) the improvement of a length of the B.9018 near the route of the existing trunk road; and (c) the construction of a new length of the B.9018 to provide an improved connection with the existing trunk road.
3. An order revoking the Perth-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Crannoch Hill Diversion) Order 1954.

Copies of the Orders have been deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh; Banff County Council, County Buildings, Banff and Cullen Town Council, 14 Reidhaven Street, Cullen, and may be seen there at all reasonable hours.
