Coming into operation 2nd September 1974

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 2nd day of September 1974, and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1974.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P8/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P3/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P5/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P9/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P3/1973), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P7/1973) and the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 6A) Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme P3A/1974).
- (3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Rates of postage

- 2.—(1) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 5 of the Scheme delete "sub-paragraph (2)" and insert instead "sub-paragraphs (2) and (3)".
- -(2) After sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 5 of the Scheme, there shall be inserted the following:
- "(3) In the case of outgoing parcels which exceed the limits of weight specified in paragraph 8(1) and which the Post Office allows to be posted, there shall be charged and paid thereon postage at rates to be fixed by the Post Office."

Insurance and Compensation

3. At the end of the scale in Part 2 of Schedule 2 to the Scheme there shall be added the following:

"Where allowed:

Exceeding 22 lb. but not exceeding 33 lb. ... 11.00 Exceeding 33 lb. but not exceeding 44 lb. ... 14.00"

ARGENTINE: OFFICIAL CERTIFICATE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Scotland) Regulations 1968, as amended, he hereby recognises,

subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the First and Second Schedules hereto as showing:—

- (a) that the meat to which they relate or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State, and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificates are recognised subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) This recognition applies to meat and meat products imported from the Argentine Republic, but does not apply to any such meat or meat product derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of labels, the recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product, and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.
- (iii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, the recognition will apply only if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product.
- (iv) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to those completed by the insertion of one of the establishment numbers currently approved by the Secretary of State for Scotland.

The Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 25th August 1972 will remain in force until 30th April 1975 from which date it is hereby revoked.

THE TESCHEN DISEASE ORDER 1974 (MADE 11th JULY 1974)

This Order (which includes provisions to enable provisions of Council Directive (EEC) No. 64/432, as amended by Council Directive (EEC) No. 71/285, in respect of restrictions on movement of swine in the event of an outbreak of Teschen disease to be implemented) comes into operation on 1st August 1974 and make the disease of swine known as Teschen disease a disease for all the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Act 1950 (article 3).

The principal provisions of the order are: —

- (1) requirements for notification in the case of an outbreak or suspected outbreak of the disease (article 4);
- (2) provision for the declaration of an infected place on receipt of such notifications, rules to be observed in such places, and the procedure to be followed in conducting a veterinary inquiry following such notifications (articles 5, 6 and 7);
- (3) further requirements as to restriction of movement and cleansing and disinfection etc. which may be applied to prevent the spread of the disease (articles 9, 10 and 11).
